# we are a hub of innovation and design

The 2020-2021 school year was different from any other year ever seen in the 127-year history of TMI. It brought our students and faculty an opportunity to learn new skills, practice core values, and implement our theme for the year, **Love Your Neighbor**, each and every day. We learned new phrases such as remote instruction and hybrid learning. We learned how to become masters at technology and helped make Zoom a household name. As Administrators, we stayed flexible and fluid, adjusted to the ever-changing uncertainties of the world, and through it all, we remained committed to raising compassionate, competent, critical-thinking students.

As each of the challenges pressed on our students, they displayed not only the ability to bend in new circumstances, they showed us how to thrive in them. Design thinking gives students a framework for learning, innovating, creating, and solving current, real-world problems while being centered on empathy, service, and reverence.

Innovation and Design is a mindset that encompasses every aspect of life at TMI and in spring 2019, TMI announced its commitment to expanding this approach. Additional courses that serve as the foundation for Innovation & Design were added to every grade level for the 2019-2020 school year. Justin Kutscherousky, Director of Innovation, was hired to oversee the growth and development of Innovation & Design throughout all courses. Construction was completed in October 2020 on a new learning lab for collaborative space — the [Walker Innovation Center](#).

We've always been innovative as a school; it's what has allowed us to adapt and grow since 1893.



# HOW MANY ALUMINUM CANS CAN I FIT IN MY POCKET?

This question, posed by Ted Elkins, a late, dear friend of Father Scott Brown, Head of School, and a lifelong tinkerer, was meant to be a bit of fun. And with a can crusher nearby, Mr. Elkins got to work on finding the answer. Little did he know that when he told this story to Father Scott, he was providing the spark for a new way of thinking about learning at TMI. The ability to wonder, to ask questions, and — most importantly — to commit to finding an answer, is at the heart of the Walker Innovation Center. Here, we want to unleash each student's natural curiosity and challenge them to find new solutions to issues facing themselves, their school, and the community.

Opened in 2020, the Walker Innovation Center is the physical hub of Innovation and Design at TMI and stands as a larger commitment to design thinking. Based on the **Stanford d.school Design Thinking process**, this insightful approach to “rethinking thinking” reflects our Episcopal roots as students gain a deeper understanding of empathy and problem solving. There are five steps to design thinking: **empathize, define, ideate, prototype, and test**. This multi-step process guides students as they explore, experiment, and bring their ideas to life; each step providing opportunities for students to think creatively, work collaboratively, and fail meaningfully.

Innovation and Design is the latest incarnation of TMI's longstanding commitment to its core values of **wisdom, integrity, service, excellence, and reverence**. With the Walker Innovation Center, we have just raised our game to give each child the freedom to wonder and the tools to change their world.

Mr. Elkins' crushed cans are on display in the Walker Innovation Center, serving as a reminder to never stop being curious. And if you are wondering ... the answer is 21 cans.



*How can a young child with cerebral palsy enjoy a toy car? This was the challenge posed by Dr. Anna Allegretti of the UT Health San Antonio Department of Occupational Therapy for TMI students. A core team of high schoolers began their design process by interviewing Dr. Allegretti and her master's level students to understand the capabilities, needs, and limitations of their new young client.*

*The project was the brainchild of TMI Director of Innovation, Justin Kutscherousky, who initiated the collaboration with UT Health San Antonio to give students the opportunity to solve real challenges for real people.*



# empathize

*Who am I helping and what is it that they need?* Empathy is the **wisdom** to open your eyes to other points of view, to talk, to listen without judgment, to ask questions ... and ask again until you understand. It is the basis for servant leadership and the critical first step each Innovation and Design student takes as they fulfill their course requirements to solve a problem for themselves, their school, and for their community. Students build vital interpersonal skills as they interview peers, teachers, and other members of the community. They learn to find connections between their own experiences and those of people whom they may have never met. When students learn to empathize, they learn to respect the dignity of all people — a lesson that will last a lifetime.

*With a broader understanding of the nature of cerebral palsy in children, the TMI design team worked together to define the problem they were trying to solve: How can we adapt a toy designed for a typically-abled child to be fun and accessible to a child with special needs? Students bolstered their design thinking with additional research on current examples of adaptive technologies for children.*



# define

As students identify who they are going to help, the next step is to define the problem they will try to solve. At this stage, students must think through a problem and articulate it with honesty and **integrity**, telling it like it is with transparency, recognizing biases and knowledge gaps, and identifying room for improvement. The question of “why?” should emerge early and often as students process their interviews and conversations. It is at this point that students narrow their thoughts and research into one problem statement based on their new insight into the person for whom they are working and the circumstances they face. The defined problem should also be inspiring — one that excites and motivates students to find the best possible solution. The challenge for students in the definition stage is to focus their thinking and their efforts — a necessary skill as students prepare to succeed in college, career, and beyond.

*Teamwork was at the forefront as students ideated solutions for adapting a toy car. Students participating in the project were there not for a grade, but because they had a passion for service and an interest in medical technology as a potential career path. Their solution: mechanize the car with a battery and handheld controls.*

# ideate

This is the white board/post-it note phase where empathizing and articulating need transition into **service**: *How can we solve this problem?* Brainstorming and bouncing ideas are the starting points for ideation. The goal is to push past the obvious solutions to find new ways of thinking about an issue. Working as a team is key during ideation. Students identify their own unique strengths and how to bring them to the table while allowing others in the team to do the same. Students build on each other's ideas, bringing creativity and ingenuity to the fore. As with the defining stage, the challenge to ideation is to stay focused, harnessing innovative ideas to develop real solutions.

# prototype

**Excellence** is rarely achieved on the first try. In the prototyping stage, students start expressing their thinking in three dimensions as they work toward a solution to their problem statement. They create simple models using common materials — construction paper, glue, Legos, computer mock-ups, etc. The goal is to quickly and easily try out a few of their best ideas to see if they have potential to be real solutions. Students can get others to try out their prototype in order to get honest feedback. Prototypes are also useful for trying out certain aspects of a project: *Does this certain color work best? Is the size right? Do my instructions make sense?* The challenge in prototyping is listening to and utilizing feedback. In prototyping, students learn to *fail forward*, learning from mistakes and continuously improving.





# test

Testing is about showing rather than telling. Once a minimum viable product (MVP) has been created, students venture out of the lab and into the real world to let the idea withstand the rigors of trial. Here they learn not only if their idea works, but they learn to have **reverence** for the process of making something better — a skill that requires students to come full circle, back to empathy for the needs of the user. Testing means setting personal feelings aside. If an idea doesn't work for the user, they learn from it and go back to the drawing board. This may be the biggest “rethinking thinking” lesson for students: failure does not have to be an end. It can be the beginning of the next idea.

*With lessons from prototyping under their belt, the TMI design team created a functional adaptive toy car. They will work closely with their partners at UT Health San Antonio again for a real test run with their young client. These test results will indicate where their design has succeeded and what aspects need to go back to the drawing board.*

*Most importantly, each student will have gained insight and hands-on experience in design thinking, worked collaboratively with peers, made connections with professionals in a high-demand career field, and pushed themselves to commit to a project, not for their own gain, but for the joy of helping others.*

## TMI I&D Classes

### Innovation and Design 1

Innovation and Design 1 provides an overview of design thinking to help students develop a systemic approach to creative problem-solving. This highly interactive class will expand thinking and tap into student curiosity, allowing them to create, test and re-create innovative solutions to a vast array of real-world problems, ultimately sharing their creations with an authentic audience. Students will practice skills like creativity, adaptive thinking, decision making, new media literacy, and empathy. The principles of design thinking can be applied to the humanities and the sciences, and emphasize interdisciplinary connections. This project-based course is open to all students in grades 9-12.

### Innovation and Design 2

Innovation and Design 2 will take the core principals of Innovation and Design 1 and build upon them through project-based learning. Using the Stanford d.school philosophy of design thinking, Innovation and Design 2 will use these principles along with technology to achieve design goals that impact TMI and the surrounding area.

### Middle School Innovation and Design/Coding

Students deepen their understanding of human-centered problem-solving skills through Design Thinking. Through projects and explorations, they engage in ideating and prototyping solutions for real-world challenges that grow empathy for their users while strengthening project management skills. This interdisciplinary course incorporates elements of science, technology, engineering, arts and math, and contemporary and interdisciplinary learning.

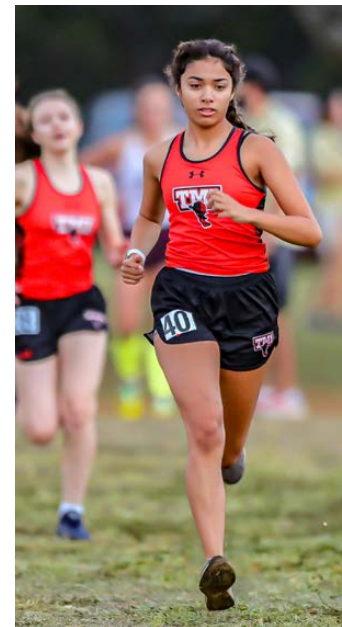
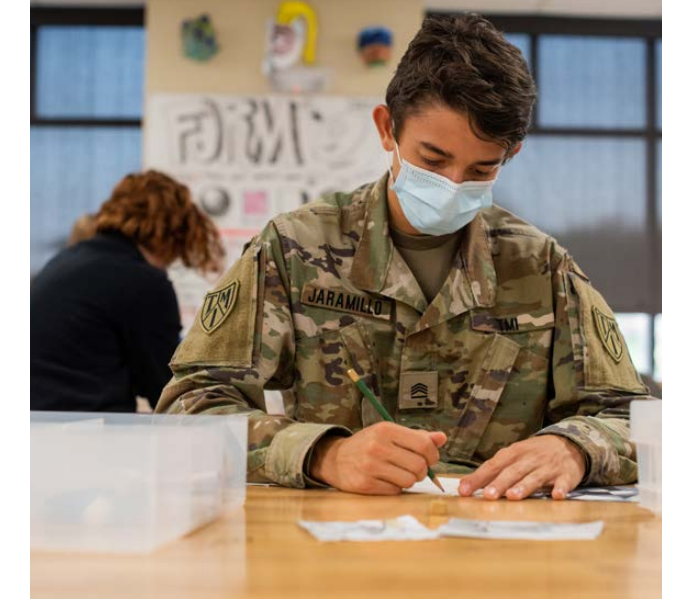

## LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE CHAIR

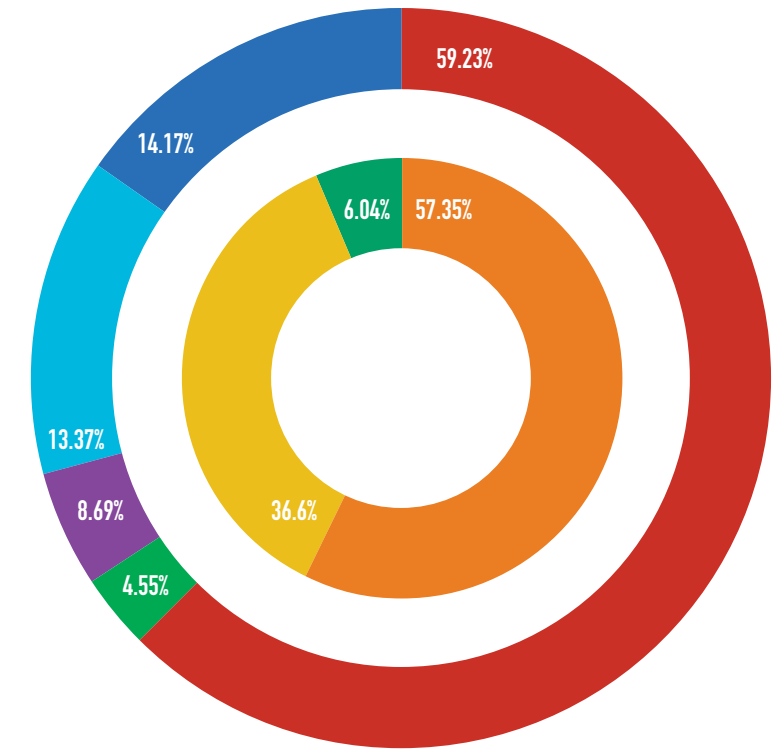

Though he was with us for only 13 years, this young man's enthusiasm for life, kindness towards others, love for family, friends, and strangers alike, as well as his strong desire to do what's right have made a lasting impact on those who had the opportunity to know him. # New Endowed Scholarship In Memory of General Ralph E. Haines '30

TMI is honored to be the recipient of a new endowment scholarship given through an IRA distribution, The GEN. Ralph E. Haines '30 Memorial Scholarship, established by Lieutenant Colonel William "Bill" Haines, USA Retired '61 in memory of his father.

LTC Bill Haines, USA (Ret) graduated from TMI in 1961. Being an Army brat, he moved worldwide and was so glad when his dad enrolled him at Texas Military Institute (TMI), to begin establishing San Antonio as the only permanent home he ever knew. He remembers TMI fondly as the place where he had influential teachers like Mr. Spiller, who taught history and made the subject come alive, won a pull-up competition with 36 completed pull-ups, then had sore arms for a week, and established life-long friendships. Most memorably, he recalls the cadets raising the flag upside down in 1961 protesting the board's decision to cancel the military program. The students' protests were heard and the board overturned their decision, allowing the military program to continue, even today.

After graduating from TMI, LTC Haines attended the University of Texas before securing a principal appointment to West Point in 1963, then graduated with a degree in engineering. He later obtained Master's degrees from the University of Southern California and the University of Alabama in systems management and systems engineering, respectively. He had many great assignments during his 23-year military career, including serving in Vietnam and flying Chinook helicopters. After retiring from the Army, he spent 23 years with an engineering firm and retired in San Antonio where he had opened an office for his company. He married his sweetheart, Linda, in 1980, and they raised their daughter, Lindsey, who grew up to be a licensed professional counselor. Their home would not have been complete without the many rescue animals they have taken in over the years.

After age 71 LTC Haines knew he would need to start taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from his Individual Retirement Account (IRA) every year. In order to reduce his taxable income without itemizing, he chose to make his donations from his RMD.

He wanted to establish a scholarship endowment in memory of his father, GEN Ralph Haines, TMI alumni and member of the TMI Hall of Fame. GEN Haines graduated from "Old Main", TMI's previous campus in Alamo Heights, in 1930. After he retired from the Army and moved to San Antonio, he was very involved with TMI, serving on various boards, speaking at numerous events, and even organizing tours. GEN Haines always preached servant leadership, and the TMI Servant Leadership Award is named after him. Establishing a new scholarship endowment in his father's name was an easy and natural choice for LTC Bill Haines because of his father's great love for TMI. His investment broker takes care of the details for him by sending the amount he specifies every month directly to TMI from his RMD.

His father had three institutions that held his great respect and meant the most to him — his church, West Point, and TMI. LTC Haines proudly remembers his father and adds, "I'm sure Dad is looking down from heaven with approval of this scholarship to help deserving students in need participate in the TMI Experience."

## TMI Alumnus Makes Long-lasting Impact In Support of Marksmanship

TMI is excited to announce a brand new endowment fund, supporting the O.S. Petty Rifle Range and Rifle Program, that has been established and made possible through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Scott Petty, Jr. '55. Scott is a TMI alumnus from the class of 1955, and the son of the late O.S. Petty, a geophysicist, early oil explorer, and inventor, with a love for marksmanship. O.S. Petty was a member of the rifle team at University of Texas, and an early founder of the Texas State Rifle Association. He passed his love of marksmanship onto his son, Scott Petty Jr., who became an accomplished marksman himself.

Scott Petty Jr. entered Texas Military Institute in the 1951-1952 school year, from San Antonio Academy. He was a member of the rifle team all four years of high school, becoming the Captain of the Varsity Rifle Team his senior year. Each year he won awards and medals including the National Championship Rifle Team Medal and the Kelly Marksmanship Trophy. His father was a great teacher and they enjoyed their time together learning and practicing marksmanship. After graduating from TMI in 1955, Scott attended the University of Texas, where he was a member of the rifle team there as well, and graduated with degrees in Petroleum Engineering and Geology Finance. He married his high school sweetheart, Louise James, in 1959 and they had 3 children before her unexpected passing in 1981. He was a lucky man to marry for love a second time in 1983 to his current wife Eleanor who had 2 children of her own. Together they have 11 grandchildren and have enjoyed many years of hunting, fishing, and appreciating the great outdoors together. Scott led productive and fulfilling careers in the US Army Corps of Engineers, as the President of Pioneer Flour Mill, and at The Petty Group. He also is a generous member of the San Antonio Community, serving on many boards and committees over the years.

When TMI moved from "Old Main", the campus in Alamo Heights, to the current campus in 1989, O.S. Petty donated the funds to build the rifle range used by TMI students today. It was a vast improvement from the range at Old Main, which was an old swimming pool that had been converted to a rifle range. The funds provided by O.S. Petty provided for the construction of a 6-lane proper range located in the lower level of Frost Athletic Center.

There are two main Rifle Team classes that take place every school year, as well as a non-Corps class offered every other year. TMI also offers a summer shooting

program for children 7-14 years of age during the "Summer at TMI" program. All courses offered during the school year and in the summer are extremely popular and often have waiting lists. Over 85% of the shooters who attend the Safety Course and Basic Rifle Marksmanship Course have no experience with shooting and are considered "First Time Shooters." Those interested in being on a top tier level team are required to shoot in all three shooting positions (prone, kneeling and standing) at a high degree of accuracy to be called "Precision Shooters." Being on the TMI Precision Shooting Team is the highest honor for a Rifle Team member and only a select number of students meet the qualifications to be on this team.

Mr. Petty wanted to be sure that the range his father donated would be taken care of and that future needs, updates and growth of the program would be financially possible. Because of Scott's generosity toward establishing the new endowment fund for the O.S. Petty Rifle Range and Rifle Program, TMI will be able to continue offering and enhancing marksmanship classes to many future students yet to come. In addition, the endowment fund is making it possible for the Corps of Cadets to establish a new TOP Rifle Team with personalized shooting equipment, that consists of one (1) team with four (4) members per year, distinguished as Petty's Sharpshooters.

In appreciation of Mr. Petty's commitment and support of our Corps of Cadets, TMI renamed its annual marksman award to the Scott Petty, Jr. '55 Expert Marksman Medal. This prestigious award is given at the end of the year for the top marksman on the TMI Corps of Cadets Rifle Team who has the highest average competitive score in the three-position marksmanship competition for the school year, and is the highest marksmanship award that may be earned by an active member on the team.

Scott's words of advice to current students are to work hard, have fun, and be honest. He added that being honest is important all your life.

TMI would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to Mr. and Mrs. Scott Petty Jr. '55 for their incredible support which enables the historical spirit of TMI to continue for future generations.

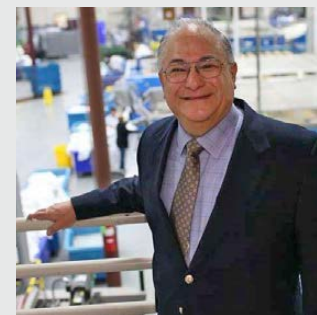

TMI Episcopal celebrated the Class of 2021 at the graduation ceremony held on the evening of Thursday, May 20. Diplomas were presented to 81 graduating seniors by the Rev. Scott Brown, Head of School, and senior awards were presented by Dean of Students Sherry Brown. The event was held outside on the school's Howell Field and as the ceremony continued into the night, a brilliant TMI-orange sunset filled the sky.

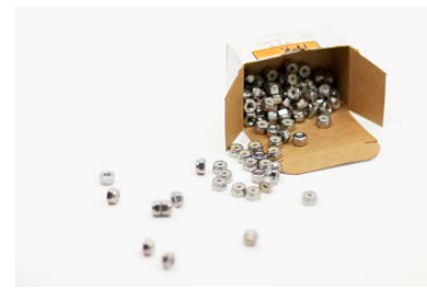
The student speaker, chosen by the faculty, was Dylan Pegg; Yu "Nikki" Fang was the recipient of the Bishop's Cup, presented to the student who has demonstrated the finest qualities of Christian citizenship and has shown due regard to the rights and needs of others;

and Joshua Thayil was the recipient of the Founder's Award, which honors the Rt. Rev. James S. Johnston, who founded the school in 1893, and is presented to the student who best embodies the mission of TMI.

Members of the TMI class of 2021 were offered a total of \$10,120,235 in scholarship funds for all four years of their college education. In state, they will attend colleges and universities including Baylor, Southern Methodist University, Southwestern, Texas A&M University at College Station, Texas Tech, Trinity, and the University of Texas at Austin. Out of state, TMI graduates will matriculate at colleges and universities including Arizona State at Tempe, Boston University, Brandeis, California Institute of Technology (Cal Tech),

Carnegie Mellon, Cornell, Harvard, Howard, Louisiana State University, Purdue University, the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, the University of Colorado at Boulder, the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Southern California; and internationally at Tecnológico de Monterrey, and the University of Chester (UK).

Of this year's graduates, 22 were designated Alpha Omega for having attended TMI from sixth through 12th grade. Another 32 qualified as members of the National Honor Society. Class of 2021 graduates also were represented as National Merit Commended Scholars, Advanced Placement Scholars, and in the National African American and National Hispanic recognition programs.
